Kanlaon Volcanic Activity

SitRep No. 26 for Kanlaon Volcanic Activity (2024)

September 22, 2024 08:00 am

On 03 June 2024, at 6:51 PM, a moderately explosive eruption occurred at the summit crater of Kanlaon Volcano. The event was recorded as an E-type earthquake that lasted six (6) minutes based on seismic data and produced a five (5) kilometer-high voluminous eruption plume. Thermal camera monitors showed material collapsing from the incandescent plume forming pyroclastic density currents or PDCs that descended the southern slopes to a distance of two (2) to three (3) kilometers. Incandescent ballistic ejecta were also observed to rain down from the eruption plume. Rumbling sounds generated by the eruption were heard in La Castellana and La Carlota City, Negros Occidental and Canlaon City, Negros Oriental. Coarse ashfall reportedly fell upon barangays of these same areas and Bago City, Negros Occidental. Sulfurous odors were also experienced by residents in these areas as well as in Kanlaon Volcano Observatory-La Carlota City (KVO-LCC) and as far away as Murcia, Negros Occidental and Bacolod City.

In view thereof, DOST-PHIVOLCS raised the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 1 (abnormal) to Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest). This means that there is current unrest driven by shallow magmatic processes that could eventually lead to further explosive eruptions or even precede hazardous magmatic eruptions.

Explosive activity at Kanlaon on 3 June 2024 was immediately succeeded by profuse degassing from the summit crater that waned by 8:20 AM on 4 June 2024 based on camera monitors. Post-eruptive degassing likely entrained volcanic ash that fell as light ashfall on the southwest sector of the volcano as reported by a KVO-LCC survey team. As of 04 June, 12:00 NN, a total of 84 weak low-frequency volcanic earthquakes events have been recorded by the KVN, consistent with current low-level degassing from the Kanlaon crater. SO2 emission measured by campaign survey has reached 4,113 tonnes/day, the highest flux this year and the second highest ever measured from Kanlaon.

Kanlaon occasionally exhibits phreatic and short-lived explosive eruptions that produce small-magnitude hazards. Of the 43 eruptions recorded since 1866 including this most recent one, only the 1902 eruption was magmatic and associated with the generation of small-volume lava flows on the upper slopes.

On 09 September 2024, 11:30 PM, DOST-PHIVOLCS issued a notice of increased seismic activity at Kanlaon Volcano. A total of twenty-five (25) volcano-tectonic or VT earthquakes have been recorded by the Kanlaon Volcano Network since 8:32 AM this morning, with the last 22 having been recorded beginning 10:35 PM this evening. Canlaon City, Negros Oriental residents report that at least five of these earthquakes were felt. VT earthquakes are generated by rock fracturing processes and the increase in VT activity may possibly precede eruptive activity.

On 10 September 2024, 11:00 AM, DOST-PHIVOLCS issued a notice of increased seismic activity at Kanlaon Volcano. A total of two hundred eighty-eight (288) volcano-tectonic or VT earthquakes have been recorded by the Kanlaon Volcano Network since 08:30 PM of 09 September 2024. The events were generated between 0 to 9 kilometers depths beneath the north-eastern flanks of the volcanic edifice and the strongest events were felt at Intensity II in some barangays of Canlaon City, Negros Oriental. Rumbling sounds were reported by some residents of Bago City. Strong sulfur fumes have been reported in a few barangays in Bago, La Carlota and Canlaon Cities. VT earthquakes are generated by rock fracturing processes and the increase in VT activity strongly indicates progressive rock-fracturing beneath the volcano as rising magma drives a path towards the surface.

At 7:00 pm, DOST-PHIVOLCS issued a notice of elevated volcanic SO2 gas flux at Kanlaon Volcano. Volcanic sulfur dioxide (SO2) gas emission from the summit crater of Kanlaon based on campaign Flyspec measurements today, 10 September 2024, averaged 9,985 tonnes/day. This is the highest emission from the volcano recorded since instrumental gas monitoring began. Kanlaon has been degassing increased concentrations of volcanic SO2 this year at an average rate of 1,273 tonnes/day prior to the 3 June 2024 eruption, but emission since then has been particularly elevated at a current average of 3,468 tonnes/day. Sulfuric odors were reported in the following localities; Brgy. Ilijan, Bago City; Brgy. Ara-al and Brgy. San Miguel, La Carlota City; Brgy. Masulog, Brgy. Linothangan and Brgy. Pula, Canlaon City.

The Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) still prevails over Kanlaon, but that current activity may lead to eruptive unrest and

an increase in the Alert Level.

-FO7's Response Team Lead Lilibeth Cabiara and DROMIC Focal Person Maribeth Bachoco-Belleza attended a coordination meeting with the LGU Officials and PHIVOLCS led by Director Teresito Bacolcol and Ma. Antonia Bornas, Chief, VMEPD.

- -DSWD FO7's Mobile Command Center Team created the encoding database template for Family Assistance Card in Emergencies and Disasters (FACED) to be used by LGU Canlaon City in the consolidation of data.
- -Psychosocial activities such as basic first aid for adults, health and hygiene promotion for teenagers, and film showing activities for child IDPs continue in coordination with the LGU, facilitated by the Philippine Red Cross Negros Oriental Chapter assisted by DSWD CMATs.
- -DSWD 7's C/MATs continue to assist the LGU in organizing morning wellness and psychological activities for adult IDPs residing in the camps.
- -The FO 7's Response Team, led by DRMD Chief Lilibeth A. Cabiara, along with CSWDO Lea Contreras gathered at the Mobile Command Center to discuss the distribution of FNFI. The meeting was convened to ensure that all families affected by the eruption of Mt. Kanlaon provided with family food packs and non-food items are all fully accounted and recorded.

12 June 2024

- -Deployed team from DSWD FO 7 led by DRMD Chief, Lilibeth A. Cabiara participated in a meeting with Canlaon City's Incident Management Team.
- -The LGU Canlaon City, together with IDPs and the deployed DSWD 7 team, participated in the Flag Raising Ceremony commemorating the 126th Independence Day celebration.
- -Following the camp closure, the Quick Response Team made an assessment to complete its deployment period to assist the LGU in the next two or three days along FACED administration and encoding as well as preparation of the QRT Report to the IMT.
- -The Technical Persons attended the RDRRMC Briefing Meeting focusing on the ways forward after camp
- -DSWD7 camp personnel provided technical assistance to the CSWDO in the conduct of camp closure orientation and assisted in the sending-off of the internally displaced persons.
- -DSWD 7's C/MATs assisted in the reintegration of two (2) unaccompanied minors back to their family.
- -C/MATs continue to support the LGU by assisting during the conduct of psychosocial activities in the camp both for adult and minor IDPs. Additionally, they continue to support the LGU in conducting morning routine wellness activity of the IDPs staying inside the camps.

13 June 2024

- -DRMD Chief Lilibeth A. Cabiara, represented DSWD in the coordination meeting with OCD Director Joel Erestain, PHIVOLCS Director Teresito Bacolcol and LGU Officials to discuss the preventive measures on the 4KM PD7
- -DROMIC Focal Person, Maribeth E. Bachoco-Belleza, oriented the CSWDO staff of Canlaon City with the deployed Quick Response Team (QRT) members on the administration and encoding of FACED. Following this, in collaboration with the Central Office Staff, the QRT members were also provided with technical assistance on the utilization of the AGAPP Mobile Application.
- -The QRT members assisted in the encoding of FACED data of affected families.
- -As part of the contingency plan for Mt. Kanlaon, DSWD 7's Mobile Command Center (MCC) joined the OCD 7 in the coordination meeting with Vallehermoso officials and assessment of staging areas and evacuation sites outside of 14 km PDZ. Set up and testing of the connectivity of the MCC was a success.
- -The FNFI Cluster of the deployed QRT in Canlaon City prepositioned the cauldron, aluminum pots and ladles readily available for setting up of a community kitchen.

14 June 2024

- -Ms. Lilibeth A. Cabiara, the Response Lead, conducted an evaluation and debriefing session for QuickResponse Team members deployed in Canlaon City. During the session, team members share their experiences, acknowledge each other's contributions, offer feedback, and express concerns and observations from their duties at the evacuation center and Mobile Command Center.
- -The DROMIC Focal Person from DSWD 7 provided training to the LGU Canlaon staff on administering and encoding of data of the Family Assistance Card in Emergencies and Disasters (FACED).
- -Deployed QRT members conducted FACED orientation to Barangay Health Workers, Day Care Workers, and Barangay Nutrition Scholars in Brgys. Pula and Masulog.

Additionally, other QRT members were augmented to facilitate the administration of FACED in the same barangays.
