## **TC JULIAN (2024)**

### **SitRep No. 19 for TC JULIAN (2024)**

**October 11, 2024 08:00 am**

On 27 September 2024, 2:00 AM, The Low Pressure Area east of Batanes has developed into Tropical Depression "JULIAN". At 11:00 AM, "JULIAN" remained almost stationary over the Philippine Sea east of Batanes.

On 28 September 2024, 5:00 AM, "JULIAN" maintained its strength while decelerating southward over the Philippine Sea. At 11:00 AM, "JULIAN" intensified into a Tropical Storm.

On 29 September 2024, 5:00 AM, "JULIAN" intensified into a Severe Tropical Storm. By 2:00 PM on the same day, it further intensified into a Typhoon.

On 30 September 2024, 5:00 AM, Batanes and Northeastern Babuyan Islands experienced violent winds as "JULIAN" continued to move over the Balintang Channel. By 11:00 AM, "JULIAN" passed near Sabtang Island, Batanes.

On 01 October 2024, 05:00 AM, "JULIAN" intensified into a Super Typhoon and moved slowly. By 9:00 AM, Super Typhoon "JULIAN" exited PAR. By 5:00 PM, "JULIAN" maintained its strength as it started to recurve north northwestward.

On 02 October 2024, 5:00 AM, "JULIAN" weakened into a Typhoon as it continued to move slowly.

On 03 October 2024, 8:00 AM, "JULIAN" re-entered PAR. By 5:00 PM, "JULIAN" made landfall over Southern Taiwan.

On 04 October 2024, "JULIAN" further weakened into a Tropical Depression at 5:00 AM and by 11:00 AM, it weakened into a Low Pressure Area and has exited the Philippine Area of Responsibility.

No Wind Signal currently hoisted.

  3. Secure seed reserves, planting materials and other farm inputs in safe and proper storage areas;
  4. Relocate farm machineries, equipment and other farm tools to higher ground;
  5. Secure sufficient feeds and water for relocated animals;
  6. Clear drainage in irrigation and rice paddies from obstructions to prevent flooding and promote fast drainage of water.



## Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

- The DSWD Disaster Response Command Center (DRCC) has transitioned to Blue Alert status following the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) Memorandum No. 240, s. 2024, which raised the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC) from White to Blue Alert in connection with Tropical Depression (TD) "JULIAN".
- The DSWD constantly monitors the situation across the country and maintains close coordination with its Field Offices to ensure the timely delivery of necessary relief assistance.

- 1,296,875 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by Super Typhoon "Julian".

### DSWD DRMG

- Attended the Pre-Disaster Risk Assessment (PDRA) Meeting relative to Tropical Depression "JULIAN".
- DRMB closely coordinates with DSWD FOs for their disaster preparedness measures and activities.
- DRMB closely coordinates with DOST-PAGASA for significant weather updates and other related information relative to TD "JULIAN".
- All DRMB Quick Response Team (QRT) members and emergency equipment are on standby and ready for deployment.
- NRLMB ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises.
- NRLMB continuously repacks goods for possible augmentation.
