SitRep No. 1 for TC JULIAN (2024)

September 28, 2024 08:00 am

On 27 September 2024, 2:00 AM, The Low Pressure Area east of Batanes has developed into Tropical Depression "JULIAN". Meanwhile, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms were experienced in Ilocos Norte, Apayao, Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, and Isabela.

At 11:00 AM, TC "JULIAN" remained almost stationary over the Philippine Sea East of Batanes. It brought moderate to heavy rains over Cagayan.

On 28 September 2024, 05:00 AM, TC "JULIAN" maintains its strength while decelerating southward over the Philippine Sea. Heavy to intense rains are forecasted over Babuyan Islands, while moderate to heavy rains over Batanes and mainland Cagayan.

TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT as of 5:00 AM:

TCWS No. 1: Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, the northeastern portion of Isabela (San Pablo, Divilacan, Maconacon, Palanan, Cabagan, Santa Maria, Tumauini, Ilagan City, San Mariano, Santo Tomas, Delfin Albano), and the eastern portion of Apayao (Luna, Pudtol, Santa Marcela, Flora).

1. Stay up to date with the weather updates released by PAGASA and Local DRRMO;

2. Harvest mature crops and mobilize post-harvest equipment and facilities;

3. Secure seed reserves, planting materials and other farm inputs in safe and proper storage areas;

4. Relocate farm machineries, equipment and other farm tools to higher ground;

5. Secure sufficient feeds and water for relocated animals;

6. Clear drainage in irrigation and rice paddies from obstructions to prevent flooding and promote fast drainage of water.
