SitRep No. 2 for TC JULIAN (2024)

September 29, 2024 08:00 am

On 27 September 2024, 2:00 AM, The Low Pressure Area east of Batanes has developed into Tropical Depression "JULIAN". Meanwhile, cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms were experienced in Ilocos Norte, Apayao, Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, and Isabela.

At 11:00 AM, TC "JULIAN" remained almost stationary over the Philippine Sea East of Batanes. It brought moderate to heavy rains over Cagayan.

On 28 September 2024, 05:00 AM, TC "JULIAN" maintained its strength while decelerating southward over the Philippine Sea. Heavy to intense rains were forecasted over Babuyan Islands, while moderate to heavy rains over Batanes and mainland Cagayan.

TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT as of 5:00 AM:

TCWS No. 1: Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, the northeastern portion of Isabela (San Pablo, Divilacan, Maconacon, Palanan, Cabagan, Santa Maria, Tumauni, Ilagan City, San Mariano, Santo Tomas, Delfin Albano), and the eastern portion of Apayao (Luna, Pudtol, Santa Marcela, Flora).

On 28 September, 11:00 PM, Tropical Storm "JULIAN" slightly intensified as it meanders over the Philippine Sea East of Cagayan. Heavy to intense rains were forecasted over Babuyan Islands, while moderate to heavy rains are forecasted over Batanes, mainland Cagayan, and Ilocos Norte.

TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT as of 11:00 PM:

TCWS No. 1: Batanes, Cagayan including Babuyan Islands, Isabela, Apayao, Abra, Kalinga, the eastern and central portions of Mountain Province (Natonin, Paracelis, Sadanga, Barlig, Bontoc), the eastern portion of Ifugao (Aguinaldo, Alfonso Lista, Mayoyao), Ilocos Norte, the northern portion of Ilocos Sur (Sinait, Cabugao, San Juan, Magsingal, Santo Domingo, Bantay, San Ildefonso, San Vicente), and the northern portion of Aurora (Dilasag, Casiguran).

On 29 September 2024, 05:00 AM, "JULIAN" intensifies into a Severe Tropical Storm.

TROPICAL CYCLONE WIND SIGNALS (TCWS) IN EFFECT as of 05:00 AM:

TCWS No. 2: The northeastern portion of Mainland Cagayan (Santa Ana) and the eastern portion of Babuyan Islands (Camiguin Is., Babuyan Is.). Heavy to intense rains are forecasted over Batanes and Babuyan Islands, while moderate to heavy rains are forecasted over Mainland Cagayan, Ilocos Norte, Apayao, Abra, and Ilocos Sur.

TCWS No. 1: Batanes, the rest of Cagayan, the rest of Babuyan Islands, Isabela, Apayao, Abra, Kalinga, the eastern and central portions of Mountain Province (Natonin, Paracelis, Sadanga, Barlig, Bontoc), the eastern portion of Ifugao (Aguinaldo, Alfonso Lista, Mayoyao), Ilocos Norte, the northern portion of Ilocos Sur (Sinait, Cabugao, San Juan, Magsingal, Santo Domingo, Bantay, San Ildefonso, San Vicente), and the northern portion of Aurora (Dilasag, Casiguran)

DOST- Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)

Continuous weather monitoring and provision of weather updates to all stakeholders.



DENR - Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB)

- Provided the List of Barangays Susceptible to Landslides and Flooding based on the DOST-PAGASA Rainfall Data GSM and WRF 72hr.
- Posting of Geohazard Threat Advisories to MGB Social Media Accounts.
- 24/7 manning of the OpCen and processing of acquired rainfall data (observed and accumulated forecast) from DOST-PAGASA for the list of barangays to be affected by the various weather systems.

Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG)

Issued DILG advisories and memorandum to all DILG regional offices and concerned LGUs to ensure that critical preparedness actions have been promptly undertaken.



Department of Agriculture (DA)

-Issued Situationer Report on Tropical Depression JULIAN

-Advised farmers and fisherfolks to perform the following preventive measures to prevent losses on agricultural products and equipment.

1. Stay up to date with the weather updates released by PAGASA and Local DRRMO;
2. Harvest mature crops and mobilize post-harvest equipment and facilities;
3. Secure seed reserves, planting materials and other farm inputs in safe and proper storage areas;
4. Relocate farm machineries, equipment and other farm tools to higher ground;
5. Secure sufficient feeds and water for relocated animals;
6. Clear drainage in irrigation and rice paddies from obstructions to prevent flooding and promote fast drainage of water.



Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

-The DSWD Disaster Response Command Center (DRCC) has transitioned to Blue Alert status following the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (NDRRMC) Memorandum No. 240, s. 2024, which raised the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC) from White to Blue Alert in connection with Tropical Depression (TD) "JULIAN".

-The DSWD constantly monitors the situation across the country and maintains close coordination with its Field Offices to ensure the timely delivery of necessary relief assistance.

Standby Funds

- A total of ₱171,407,132.56 standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, ₱123,407,132.56 is the available Quick Response Fund (QRF) in the CO.

Stockpiles

- A total of 1,908,532 family food packs (FFPs) amounting to ₱1,481,069,893.34, other food items amounting to ₱276,515,203.86, and non-food items (NFIs) amounting to ₱919,398,202.15 are available.

DSWD DRMG
