



## **Kanlaon Volcano Eruption (2024)**

### **SitRep No. 13 for Kanlaon Volcano Eruption (2024)**

**December 17, 2024, 8:00 PM**

On 09 December 2024, an explosive eruption occurred at the summit vent of Kanlaon Volcano from 3:03 PM to 3:10 PM. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 4,000 meters above the vent and was bent and drifted by strong winds to the west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents or PDCs descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.

Ashfall was reported over a wide area west of the volcano while Pyroclastic density currents or PDCs, hazardous mixtures of hot volcanic gas, ash, and fragmented rock, were generated at the base of the eruption column and descended the south-southeastern sides of the edifice based on camera monitors. The longest descent of the PDCs from the summit crater was estimated to be approximately 2 to 3.4 kilometers in Masolog, La Castellana, still within the four-kilometer radius of the Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ).

In view thereof, DOST-PHIVOLCS raised the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest). This means magmatic eruption have begun that may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

### **National**

#### **NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)**

- Issued the following NDRRMC Memoranda

- Issued DILG Memorandum dated 09 December 2024, relative to the Activation of EOC and DORMS of DILG Negros Island Region to closely monitor the situations within their respective jurisdictions and ensure that the concerned LGUs are implementing the minimum critical preparedness actions for Volcanic Eruptions;
- Issued and disseminated the DILG Advisory on the “Additional Preparedness for Response for Kanlaon Volcano Eruption (Alert Level 3)”, dated 12 December 2024;

#### **Department of Health (DOH)**

- Issued Public Health Advisory relative to the Kanlaon Volcanic Activity on 09 December 2024.
- Convened the Health Cluster to discuss the needs in the affected areas and ensure the alignment of all support, initiatives and activities.
- Conduct of virtual meeting with the CHDs VI, VII and NIR to discuss the response operations, including the needs and ongoing activities and initiatives in the affected areas.
- Ongoing facilitation of delivery of additional logistics from other CHDs and hospitals to NIR.



- Continuous and close coordination with CHDs, government agencies and partners to ensure the following:
  - Uninterrupted delivery of essential health services;
  - Readiness of hospitals to handle the potential surge in patients;
  - Continuous assessment of health conditions in evacuation centers and the community to identify and respond to potential outbreaks;
  - Availability of health emergency commodities (HECs); and
  - Immediate deployment of HERTs, as needed
- Issued an advisory to all affected CHDs on the Health Sector Preparedness and Response to Mt. Kanlaon Eruption
- Timely dissemination of health advisories to inform affected communities about potential risks and preventive measures.
- Medical and Public Health
  - Mobilized prepositioned logistics through the PHOs/Provincial DRRM-H Managers.
  - Deployed disease surveillance officers to verify reports of increasing cases of respiratory illnesses in Guimaras, and monitor health conditions in evacuation centers.
  - Coordinated with OCDs VI and VII for the provision of thermal blankets or blankets to affected individuals in the evacuation centers.
  - Facilitated the delivery of additional logistics such as alcohol gallons, eye protection, N95 masks, face masks, and mosquito nets to the affected LGUs.
  - Continuous conduct of consultations and provision of essential health services in evacuation centers and communities.
    - As of December 10, 2024, a total of 30 consultations have been reported.

**Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)**

- Standby Funds
  - PhP31.96 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
  - PhP5 million available at DSWD FO VI and VII.

  - 261,018 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 107,548 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 153,470 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
  - 190,706 FFPs available at DSWD FOs VI and VII.
  - 1,056,003 FFPs in other DSWD FOs which may support the relief needs of the families affected by the Kanlaon Volcano eruption through inter-FO augmentation.
  - PhP873.13 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD Field Office warehouses.
- Directed the Regional Directors of Field Offices (Western Visayas) and Central Visayas to coordinate with the affected Local Government Units (LGUs) to assure them that the agency is ready to respond to all those who will be affected by the volcanic eruption.
- Disaster Response Management Bureau (DRMB) closely coordinates with DSWD FOs for significant disaster response updates relative to the eruption of Kanlaon Volcano.
- DRMB closely coordinates with DOST-PHIVOLCS for significant updates and other related information relative to the Kanlaon Volcano eruption.
- National Resource and Logistics Management Bureau (NRLMB) ensures the replenishment and availability of FNIs for resource augmentation to DSWD FOs as need arises.



#### **Department of Agriculture (DA) DRRM**

- In anticipation of the effects of the Kanlaon Volcanic Activity in the agriculture and fisheries sector, the Department, through Regional Field Offices (RFOs) VI and VII, is advising farmers and concerned Local Government Units (LGUs) to implement the following preparedness measures:
  1. Continuous monitoring of the Kanlaon Volcano and its possible impact on agriculture and fisheries;
  2. Dissemination of advisory to farmers and fisherfolk through all available media of communication;
  3. Close coordination with LGUs, particularly agricultural, veterinary and P/C/MDRRMC offices and other DRRM-related agencies;
  4. Updating of animal inventory and identification of locations for possible animal evacuation centers and resources needed for animals.
- The DA RFOs in affected areas are undertaking the following:
  1. Monitoring and assessment of the actual field situation for damage and losses incurred in the agriculture and fisheries sector;
  2. Close coordination with other National and Regional DRRM-related offices, as well as Local Government Unit counterparts for the Department's response strategies;
  3. Continuous monitoring of prices and movement of agricultural commodities;
  4. Positioning and deployment of rescue vehicles and veterinary supplies for livestock animals; and
  5. Mobilization of the DA Negros Occidental Research Outreach Station (DA-NOROS) in La Carlota City to accommodate evacuated livestock animals.

#### **Department of Education (DepEd)**

- Issued a policy on the implementation of Dynamic Learning Program (DLP), as an intervention to ensure learning continuity, for schools affected by Kanlaon eruption.
- Instituted safety measures on the impacts of volcanic eruption to affected regions and divisions, DepEd Quick Response and Recovery Team (QRRT), and Education Cluster Partners through various communication channels.
- Collaborated with authorized concerned government agencies and affected regions to identify the list of schools and personnel within the Permanent and Extended Danger Zones; and
- Provided support funds for the following response interventions:
  - Clean-Up and Clearing Operations
  - Hygiene Kits, including KN95 masks
  - Minor Repair
  - Learners' and Teachers' Kits

#### **Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR)**

- DENR Region 6 and 7 deployed Quick Response Teams (QRTs) for situation assessment.
- EMB Region 6 and 7 conducted continuous Ambient Air quality Checking and Monitoring.
- MGB Region 7 provided geohazard data and inputs in the development and enhancement of Contingency Plan for Kanlaon.

#### **Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP)**

- Deployed personnel to respond to the incident.

    - QRT members distributed food and non-food items, which included 1,313 FFPs, 206 each of Family, Hygiene and 107 Sleeping Kits, amounting to ₱1,755,646.00 in Camps 4, 5 and 6.
    - QRT Vice Chairperson for Administration, Tonyson Luther S. Lee, led the distribution of Food and Non-Food Items (FNFI). - c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management



- The City Action Team conducted a site-visit to the evacuation center in MEMS to support the LGU in evacuation center management, continuous data validation, and monitoring.
- FO7's QRT Action Officer facilitated a planning session was facilitated by the Action Officer with the CSWDO of Canlaon City to prepare for the opening of evacuation centers. This included assigning of the camp personnel from the LGU, province, and DSWD in anticipation of the increase of IDPs due to the forced evacuation of residents within the 4-kilometer PDZ and the selective evacuation of vulnerable sectors within the 6-kilometer PDZ. (Alert Level 3).
- The Quick Response Team (QRT) led by Vice Chair, continues to actively oversee and provide assistance to the LGU of Canlaon City in the implementation of camp management activities.
- A briefing for the deployment of the augmented 20 new camp personnel for the day shift was conducted while discussion was also made with the 23 camp personnel deployed in the night shift for the identification of gaps and needs of the camps. The findings were subsequently presented in the Camp Management Committee Meeting presided by Mayor, hence basic needs on WASH and food are assigned to key offices.
- The QRT Chairperson, called for a quick 'kumustahan' with the deployed QRT, where each assistant camp manager was asked to identify the top issues they observed in the evacuation centers within their AOR
- The deployed QRT conducted a reorientation of the evacuation center house rules, organized community kitchen committee volunteers, and established storage and distribution committee volunteers, assigning team leaders to each room in Camp 2-Jose Cardenas Memorial High School (JBCMHS) Uptown Campus.
- The DSWD-7 QRT joined the LDRRM Council coordination meeting convened by Canlaon City Mayor to discuss the areas for improvement in the camp management operation.
- The DSWD-7 QRT joined the IMT coordination meeting convened by Canlaon City Mayor Jose Chubasco Cardenas to discuss the areas for improvement in the camp management operation as well as other response interventions.
- QRT camp personnel across the 8 camps assisted the LGU camp personnel on camp activities.
- The QRT extended assistance to the LGU in managing the internally displaced persons (IDPs) at the newly established evacuation center (Camp 8). The team also supported efforts to ensure the orderly profiling of the IDPs.

d. Internally Displaced Protection

- The deployed City Action Team assisted the LGU in conducting psychosocial activities for children housed at the MEMS evacuation center. They also supported efforts in food distribution and data validation.
- The QRT members in Camp 2 (Jose Cardenas Memorial High School Uptown Campus), along with the LGU's RHU Nutrition Council Officer, conducted a 'kamustahan' with the IDPs.
- The QRT CCCM Cluster, deployed across five camps, supported the LGU in facilitating activities for the IDPs, including early morning devotions and educational sessions for children.
- The QRT CCCM Cluster, deployed across 6 camps, supported the LGU in facilitating activities for the IDPs, including early morning devotions and educational sessions for children.
- The QRT CCCM Cluster, deployed across 6 camps, continued to provide support to the Local Government Unit of Canlaon City in coordinating and facilitating various activities for the Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs). These activities include early morning



devotions, zumba exercises, education sessions for children and psychosocial activities for women aimed at promoting physical well-being and community engagement among the displaced individuals.

- The QRT CCCM Cluster assisted the LGU in opening the 7th camp and continue to provide support across the existing camps. These activities include early morning devotions, zumba exercises, education sessions for children and psychosocial activities for children and women aimed at promoting physical well-being and community engagement among the displaced individuals.
- The deployed CCCM members to 8 camps continue to work closely with the LGU to assist in facilitating camp activities. They help lead morning exercise sessions, such as Zumba dance, assist in processing pass slips for working IDPs and meal distribution, and join the morning meeting with CSWDO staff to kick off the day's shift
- Camp personnel in Camp 4 - Canlaon City Sports & Cultural Center, facilitated psychosocial activities for children.

#### e. Other Activities

- 9 December 2024
  - The DSWD 7 is in close coordination with Canlaon City CDRRMO, CSWDO and C/MATs to gather further information about the incident. Regional Director has provided assurance to the LGU and the Governor, regarding the necessary augmentation support.
  - DSWD 7 also joined the coordination meeting called by RDRRMC 7. Further, eight (8) City Action Team members also attended the Emergency Meeting called by the CDRRMC.
- 10 December 2024
  - DSWD 7 QRT joined the LDRRM Council Coordination meeting convened by Canlaon City Mayor to discuss the implementation of the forced evacuation center.
  - DSWD-7 Quick Response Team (QRT) Vice Chair and QRT Action Officer, met with Canlaon City Mayor, OCD Directors for Region VI and VII and NIR to discuss the situation of families affected by the Mt. Kanlaon eruption.
  - DSWD Region 7's Regional Director traveled to Bacolod City to meet with Secretary Rex Gatchalian to ensure quick response to the families affected by the eruption.
  - ARDO, together with the DRMD Chief, leads the deployment of FO 7's Mobile Command Center (MCC) to Canlaon City.
  - An online emergency meeting with the QRT Team Members was initiated by the DRMD Response Team to discuss operations related to Mt. Kanlaon's Alert Level 3 status.
- 11 December 2024
  - The DSWD-7 Quick Response Team (QRT) has set up the agency's Mobile Command Center to streamline coordination, enhance communication, and ensure efficient response efforts for the affected community.
- 12 December 2024
  - The Mobile Command Center (MCC) was utilized during the RDRRMC meeting convened by OCD 7, which was attended by QRT members
  - The QRT's Vice Chair and Action Officer joined the Incident Management Team meeting to discuss updates from the cluster leads and results from the forced evacuation "Pulong-Pulong".
  - The assigned AGAPP (Advanced Data Gathering for Assistance Preparedness for Protection) reporters have started inputting the information board data into AGAPP to enhance disaster response coordination and ensure timely delivery of assistance.





- 14 December 2024
  - In addition to the DSWD 7's consistent participation in the RDRRMC meetings concerning the Kanlaon Operations, the Quick Response Team (QRT) Chair, Shalaine Marie S. Lucero, also took part in the Regional Inter-Agency Coordinating Cell (RIACC) Meeting, during which identified gaps were articulated, and prospective remedial measures were proposed.
  - QRT 7 Chair Lucero, the Action Officer, Cluster Leads, and the Planning Officer of Canlaon City discussed with Mayor Marianne S. Gustilo of Vallehermoso, Negros Oriental, on the establishment of an Emergency Operations Center (EOC) and the hosting of CCCM/IDP Protection for those potentially affected in a worst-case scenario during the courtesy call. Further, she was invited by the IMT on the discussion about financial assistance
  - DRIMS staff provided technical assistance on AGAPP reporting to deployed AGAPP reporters in 5 camps. This guidance ensured that the reporters could effectively and promptly gather and share important information.
  - The QRT Donation Cluster Lead conducted an orientation for the Donation and Management Committee, ensuring they are properly informed and equipped to oversee the distribution and management of donated resources for the IDPs.
- **15 December 2024**
  - QRT Team 2 attended a deployment briefing led by Ms. Cabiara, covering key topics such as the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) structure, the status of IDFs/IDPs, and the Deployment Guide. Reminders on procedures and safety were also provided. Regional Director Lucero shared her guidance to align the team's objectives with the overall operational strategy.
