Kanlaon Volcano Eruption (2024)

SitRep No. 28 for Kanlaon Volcano Eruption (2024)

January 02, 2025 08:00 am

On 09 December 2024, an explosive eruption occurred at the summit vent of Kanlaon Volcano from 3:03 PM to 3:10 PM. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 4,000 meters above the vent and was bent and drifted by strong winds to the west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents or PDCs descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.

Ashfall was reported over a wide area west of the volcano while Pyroclastic density currents or PDCs, hazardous mixtures of hot volcanic gas, ash, and fragmented rock, were generated at the base of the eruption column and descended the south-southeastern sides of the edifice based on camera monitors. The longest descent of the PDCs from the summit crater was estimated to be approximately 2 to 3.4 kilometers in Masolog, La Castellana, still within the four-kilometer radius of the Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ).

In view thereof, DOST-PHIVOLCS raised the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest). This means magmatic eruption have begun that may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

AFFECTED POPULATION

A total of 12,043 families or 46,259 persons were affected. Of which, 4,387 families or 14,321 persons were served inside 34 ECs and 2,195 families or 6,987 persons were served outside ECs:

- QRT Vice Chair Juanito C. Cantero, along with the response team, distributed a total of 494 Family Food Packs (FFPs) and 247 Family Kits, amounting to PhP 982,566.00, to the displaced families in Camp3-Jose B. Cardenas Memorial High School (JBCMHS) Main Campus.

- QRT members distributed food and non-food items, which included 1,313 FFPs, 206 each of Family, Hygiene and 107 Sleeping Kits, amounting to PhP 1,755,646.00 in Camps 4,5 and 6.
- QRT Vice Chairperson for Administration, Tonyson Luther S. Lee, led the distribution of Food and Non-Food Items (FNFI). These FNFI are formally handed over to the camps and are being distributed to the affected families. A total of 86 Family Food Packs (FFPs) and 399 sets of Family, Sleeping, and Hygiene Kits are provided to the IDPS in Camps 1 and 6, amounting to PhP 2,202,272.00.

c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management

This included assigning of the camp personnel from the LGU, province, and DSWD in anticipation of the increase of IDPs due to the forced evacuation of residents within the 4-kilometer PDZ and the selective evacuation of vulnerable sectors within the 6-kilometer PDZ. (Alert Level 3).
- The Quick Response Team (QRT) led by Vice Chair, continues to actively oversee and provide assistance to the LGU of Canlaon City in the implementation of camp management activities.

- The deployed QRT conducted a reorientation of the evacuation center house rules, organized community kitchen committee volunteers, and established storage and distribution committee volunteers, assigning team leaders to each room in Camp 2-Jose Cardenas Memorial High School (JBCMHS) Uptown Campus.
- The DSWD-7 QRT joined the LDRRM Council coordination meeting convened by Canlaon City Mayor to discuss the areas for improvement in the camp management operation.
- The DSWD-7 QRT joined the IMT coordination meeting convened by Canlaon City Mayor Jose Chubasco Cardenas to discuss the areas for improvement in the camp management operation as well as other response interventions.
- QRT camp personnel across the 8 camps assisted the LGU camp personnel on camp activities.
- The QRT extended assistance to the LGU in managing the internally displaced persons (IDPs) at the newly established evacuation center (Camp 8). The team also supported efforts to ensure the orderly profiling of the IDPs.
- QRT-CCCM members continue to provide support in the camps by assisting on breakfast distribution, issuance of pass slip, managing data, and updating the EC information board. They are also actively involved in posting and discussion of the evacuation rules.
- The QRT continues to help the LGU distribute activity sheets and learning modules to grade school children, while also organizing storytelling sessions, playtime, and exercise.
- Assisted the LGU in the establishment of the 9th camp Linothangan Elementary School.
- The deployed QRT continues to support the LGU in managing the camps through profiling IDPs, setting

ground rules in ECs, distributing learning modules to grade school children, and aiding in the distribution of donations.

- QRT camp personnel, in coordination with DOH and BHW, conducted an inspection to ensure a healthy and safe environment in the evacuation center.
- QRT camp personnel across the 8 camps assisted the LGU camp personnel on camp activities.
- DSWD-7's Quick Response Team, led by Vice Chairperson for Administration Tonyson Luther Lee, attended a Camp Manager's Meeting with Canlaon City Mayor Jose Chubasco Cardenas to discuss updates and concerns regarding evacuation centers.
- Ananisa Aviso visited Camp 8 (St. Joseph College of Canlaon) to inspect the shelter facilities and check the situation of the internally displaced persons (IDPs) in Camp 9 at Linothangan Elementary School.
- QRT-CCCM members continue to provide support in the camps by assisting on breakfast distribution, issuance of pass slip, managing data, and updating the EC information board.
- They also continued administration of the Family Assistance Card in Emergencies and Disasters (FACED) to verify the information of the IDPs.
- QRT members continue to support the LGU by assisting with morning devotions, administering FACED, issuing pass slips, helping with breakfast distribution, and leading the Zumba dance exercise. They also visited each room to discuss house rules, organized committees, and assign roles to ensure effective camp management and cleanliness.
- QRT conducted a thorough inspection of the installed Family Tents to be utilized as Child-Friendly and Women-Friendly Spaces, ensuring that the tents were properly set up, well-maintained, and equipped to support the well-being of the IDPs. Additionally, along with warehouse personnel, Canlaon City Sanitary Inspector Concordia Llanes and other camp staff demonstrate Water Filtration. This is crucial role in ensuring access to clean and safe drinking water.
- QRT Members in Camps 3 and 6 conducted child-friendly age-appropriate activities, including drawing, dancing, singing, and storytelling, thereby providing a therapeutic medium for both learning and personal development.
- QRT Members continue to administer FACED and assist LGU in the issuance of pass slips of IDPs to attend to their livelihood.
- DSWD camp personnel together with the PNP, DOH, LGU continues to manage, monitor and facilitate camp activities and services inside the camps such as physical, mental/psychological, spiritual, water and sanitation and clean-up drive activities.
- QRT camp personnel on the PM shift across all camps supported the morning activities, including leading morning devotion, coordinating Zumba sessions, and facilitating the issuance of access slips.

To address common health concerns among children, the Camp 9 QRT team coordinated with DOH personnel stationed at the camp to hold a Basic Health Session. The session included topics like dental hygiene, proper handwashing, and other vital health practices.

-QRT camp personnel offered stress debriefing and psychosocial support to 14 IDP families, helped reconcile families with misunderstandings, prepared IDs for Parent Leaders, organized sports activities for children and supported daily prayer meetings in Camp 5.

-In Camp 7, QRT camp personnel led the Getting to Know You activity and Psychosocial Processing sessions were conducted with 32 participants aged 19-59 years and 8 participants aged 60 and above. QRT camp personnel in Camp 2 facilitated a Child Friendly Space activity for children aged 5-10 years, in collaboration with the Child Development Workers.

--The QRT Team in Camp 7 conducted Child-Friendly Spaces (CFS) activities, which included dance and coloring sessions, as well as sports activities for the IDPS.
