## Kanlaon Volcano Eruption (2024)

## SitRep No. 4 for Kanlaon Volcano Eruption (2024)

December 13, 2024, 8:00 AM

On 09 December 2024, an explosive eruption occurred at the summit vent of Kanlaon Volcano from 3:03 PM to 3:10 PM. The eruption produced a voluminous plume that rapidly rose to 4,000 meters above the vent and was bent and drifted by strong winds to the west-southwest. Pyroclastic density currents or PDCs descended the slopes on the general southeastern edifice based on IP and thermal camera monitors.

Ashfall was reported over a wide area west of the volcano while Pyroclastic density currents or PDCs, hazardous mixtures of hot volcanic gas, ash, and fragmented rock, were generated at the base of the eruption column and descended the south-southeastern sides of the edifice based on camera monitors. The longest descent of the PDCs from the summit crater was estimated to be approximately 2 to 3.4 kilometers in Masolog, La Castellana, still within the four-kilometer radius of the Permanent Danger Zone (PDZ).

In view thereof, DOST-PHIVOLCS raised the Alert Level of Kanlaon Volcano from Alert Level 2 (increasing unrest) to Alert Level 3 (magmatic unrest). This means magmatic eruption have begun that may progress to further explosive eruptions. All local government units are advised to evacuate the 6-km radius from the summit of the volcano and must be prepared for additional evacuation if activity warrants.

#### **NDRRM Operations Center (NDRRMOC)**

- EOC maintains ongoing coordination with C/MDRRMC, RDRRMC, PNP, AFP, BFP, PCG, and other agencies;
- Uniformed personnel from PNP and BFP are present in the EOC for close coordination and monitoring
- The latest weather conditions and related incidents are constantly monitored through C/M DRRMOs in their respective Area of Responsibility (AOR)
- Close coordination with the PDRRMC Member-Agency is maintained;
- Situational reports of monitored incidents are submitted to the Office of the Governor, DILG VI, OCD VI and other relevant offices/agencies.
- Emergency response equipment, vehicles and resources are prepositioned for possible deployment.
- All PDRRMO response units are on standby for possible deployment.
- Established response protocol and operating procedures are ready for emergencies.
- All rescue equipment is regularly checked to ensure operational readiness.
- Conducted PDRA Meeting with the C/MDRRMOs and PDRRM Council last Oct 23, 2024.
- Close coordination with Bacolod Maritime Police Station Chief, PCPT Reynaldo A Bauden, Jr, together with PMSg Robert Immatong, and PSSg Harry M. Gentuga.
- Requested updates from Kanlaon Volcano Observatory for the current state of the volcano.
- Requested updates from different LGUs for the effects of activity from the volcano.
- Established direct connection to the different LGUs.

- Took part in the conduct of an aerial inspection and survey over Kanlaon Volcano and impact areas surrounding it.

#### **Canlaon City DRRMO**

- After the rapid eruption of Mt. Kanlaon, Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (LDRRMC) convened for an emergency meeting
- Activated the Incident Command System (ICS) and coordinated emergency responses. Teams, including the BDRRM Elite Group, PNP, BFP personnel, and other agencies, were deployed to assist affected barangays, particularly Masulog and Pula. Evacuees were transported from pick-up points to evacuation centers, with face masks distributed to mitigate ashfall risks. While there were no reported sulfuric odors in Barangays Malaiba, Lumapao, and Linothangan, residents were advised to monitor their areas closely. Evacuation centers at Macario Española Memorial School (MEMS) and Jose B. Cardenas Memorial High School (JBCMHS) Uptown Campus are accommodating evacuees, with numbers still increasing.
- The LGU of Canlaon suspended classes and government work (except for essential personnel) and closely coordinated weather monitoring to address potential heavy rainfall. (EO88)
- Work in Government offices is suspended except for essential personnel (EO88)
- Curfew from 10:00PM to 4:00AM has been imposed as per EO
- Liquor ban is in effect across the city to minimize disruptions in evacuation centers and affected communities.
- CSWDO established community kitchen inside EC
- Deployed CCCM Personnel
- The Provincial DRRM conducted status checks and supported evacuation centers. Continuous
  monitoring of the volcano's activity is ongoing, with SITREPs sent to provincial and regional

- DSWD-7 Quick Response Team (QRT) Vice Chair Juanito Cantero and QRT Action Officer Lilibeth Cabiara, met with Canlaon City Mayor Jose Chubasco Cardenas, OCD Directors for Region VI and VII and NIR to discuss the situation of families affected by the Mt. Kanlaon eruption.
- DSWD Region 7's Regional Director Shalaine Marie S. Lucero traveled to Bacolod City to meet with Secretary Rex Gatchalian to ensure quick response to the familiesaffected by the eruption.
- ARDO Juanito C. Cantero, together with the DRMD Chief, leads the deployment of FO 7's Mobile Command Center (MCC) to Canlaon City.
- An online emergency meeting with the QRT Team Members was initiated by the DRMD Response Team to discuss operations related to Mt. Kanlaon's Alert Level 3 status.

### • 11 December 2024

 The DSWD-7 Quick Response Team (QRT) has set up the agency's Mobile Command Center to streamline coordination, enhance communication, and ensure efficient response efforts for the affected community.

- Develop contingency plans to address potential disruption to healthcare service, including alternative delivery of essential health services and safeguarding healthcare facilities from ash damage;
- Prioritize admissions and activate surge capacity plan of health facilities;
- Ensure that the Cluster approach is activated and operational to coordinate medical and public health, water, sanitation and hygiene (WASH), nutrition, and MHPSS to have a comprehensive and effective response to the health needs of the affected population.
