Region 6

OCD VI

- In close coordination with the affected LGUs re the incident.
- Continuous monitoring of the AOR.

PDRRMO Negros Occidental

- ? Emergency Operations Center and Emergency 911 operate 24/7;
- ? Continuously monitors Weather advisories and other related information issued by DOST-PAGASA;
- ? REDAS Software and Kanlaon Live Feed Monitoring are utilized regularly;
- ? The latest situation updates, weather conditions, and related incidents are constantly monitored through C/MDRRMOs in their respective Area of Responsibility (AOR)
- ? Information is continuously disseminated through traditional media and radio outlets, email, SMS text blast, Facebook Page, messenger, and LDRRMOs group chat;
- ? EOC maintains ongoing coordination with C/MDRRMC, RDRRMC, PNP, AFP, BFP, PCG, and other agencies;
- ? Uniformed personnel from PNP and BFP are present in the EOC for close coordination and monitoring
- ? Close coordination with the PDRRMC Member-Agency is maintained;
- ? Situational reports of monitored incidents are submitted to the Office of the Governor, DILG VI/NIR, OCD VI/NIR and other concerned offices/agencies.
- ? All rescue equipment is regularly checked to ensure operational readiness.
- ? Emergency response equipment, vehicles and resources are prepositioned for possible deployment.
- ? All PDRRMO response units are on standby for possible deployment.
- ? Established response protocol and operating procedures are ready for emergencies.
- ? All rescue equipment is regularly checked to ensure operational readiness.

San Carlos CDRRMO

1. Rivers and creeks water level monitoring both in Northbound and Southbound.
2. All ERT and Pilot Requests sent to all CDRRMO Personnel.
3. Constant communication and updates to Barangays to monitor the water level of their rivers and creeks.
4. Constant communication and updates to all Barangays for weather updates.
5. Logistics preparations in the Operation Center.
6. Constant monitoring of flood level and magnitude around the city and provide updates of EOC.
7. Went to evacuation areas and get the necessary data from DSWD regarding the number of IDPs.
8. Posting of public advisories for floods in social media.
