SitRep No. 3 for the Observance of Holy Week (Semana Santa) 2025

April 16, 2025 08:00 am

The Lenten Season or Semana Santa is a significant annual religious observance for the Filipino Roman Catholics. It begins on Palm Sunday and continues on through Easter Sunday. During this season, people go to churches to attend mass to reflect and offer prayers.

Also, Catholics observe Spanish-influenced rituals such as processions, passion plays (senakulo), and pabasa. It is also an opportunity for families to spend time together.

Easter Sunday culminates the celebration of Semana Santa, viewed as the greatest feast of the Church year. It is one of the most festive events, a day of joy, and celebration for the faithful commemorating Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead.

The Frontal System and the Easterlies will be the dominant weather systems affecting the country throughout the Observance of Semana Santa (14 - 20 April 2025)

On 14 April, the Frontal System will bring cloudy skies with rains over Cagayan, Batanes, and Apayao. Meanwhile, Zamboanga Peninsula and BARMM will also experience cloudy skies with scattered rains and thunderstorms due to the Easterlies. The rest of the country will have partly cloudy to cloudy skies, with the possibility of isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms mostly in the eastern section.

On 15 April, the Frontal System will continue to cause cloudy skies with scattered rains and isolated thunderstorms over Cagayan Valley, Apayao, and Aurora. On the other hand, partly cloudy to cloudy skies are expected over the rest of the country, with a chance of brief rainshowers or thunderstorms mostly in the eastern section.

From Wednesday to Sunday (16–20 April), the whole archipelago will experience warm and humid conditions, with the possibility of localized rainshowers or thunderstorms in the afternoon or evening due to the easterlies.

National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Operations Center (NDRRMOC)

- Issued Memorandum No. 082, s. 2025 dated 20 March 2025 re: Raising of the Alert Status to BLUE effective 12 April 2025 to 21 April 2025 ICOW the Observance of the Holy Week (Semana Santa) 2025.

Department of Energy (DOE)

- Coordinated with power generation companies, transmission concessionaire, and distribution utilities to ensure grid stability and readiness throughout the long holiday.
- Put in place contingency plans to address possible demand surges or local disruptions, especially in high tourist destinations and island provinces.
- Coordinated with petroleum retailers to ensure sufficient fuel inventory and efficient operations at gasoline service stations along major expressways and arterial roads.



DOST- Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA)

Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD)

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to Php 2,901,304,676.08.

Standby Funds

- A total of Php 92,054,094.69 standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, Php 46,332,394.69 is the available Quick Response Fund (QRF) in the CO.

Stockpiles

A total of 2,727,013 family food packs (FFPs) amounting to Php 1,874,065,817.03, other food items amounting to Php 69,475,029.59 and non-food items amounting to Php 865,709,734.77 are available.

- Caraga RDRRMC-EOC is on 24/7 monitoring and continuously coordinating with all concerned agencies for possible response actions for any untoward incidents within its Area of Responsibility (AOR).

DILG

- Issued Memorandum Circular No. 2025-038, dated April 11, 2025 re: “Ensuring A Safe and Peaceful Observance of the Semana Santa 2025”, directing all Local Chief Executives (LCEs) to:
- Convene the Local Peace and Order Council (LPOC), Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (LDRRMC), and/or other local teams for action planning, anticipating, and preparing for the heavy movement of people from various places with focus on ensuring the availability of adequate, safe, and orderly public transportation, emergency medical services, among others;
- Cause the mobilization and deployment of law and traffic enforcers, barangay tanods, Barangay Peacekeeping Action Teams (BPATs), public safety forces, medical personnel, and other force multipliers in;
- Local and national roads to provide assistance and intensify visibility to the traveling public and motorists, and intensify effective traffic management;
- Deploying patrols in "hotspots" and/or crime-prone areas within the provinces, cities, and municipalities to prevent the entry and exit of lawless elements, and to apprehend individual/s violating laws, rules, and policies;
- Ensuring safety and security at air and seaports, and other transportation terminals, pilgrimage churches, malls, markets, travel destinations, and public places, among others;
- Ensure the cleanliness and orderliness of the communities, by mobilizing all resources in garbage collections and disposal, and clean-up operations of all public places, especially after the conduct of various religious and social activities;
- Implement other necessary measures, as may be identified, to ensure peaceful and safe observance of Semana Santa 2025;
- The Philippine National Police (PNP) and the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) are likewise directed to be on full alert and to coordinate with, and provide necessary assistance to LGUs in employing stringent and appropriate measures to ensure the peaceful, orderly, and safe observance of Semana Santa 2025;
- The BFP is also directed to continue its awareness campaigns among communities, especially in anticipation of the Semana Santa, and to ensure preparedness measures in cases of fire emergencies;
- All DILG Regional Directors are directed to cause the immediate and widest dissemination of this Memorandum Circular to all LGUs within their areas of responsibility.

DSWD

a. Standby Funds and Prepositioned Relief Stockpile

- A total of PhP 1,831,700.00 worth of standby funds available and PhP 143,205,435.34 worth of stockpile of various food and non-food items;
- Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items
- A total of 169,145 Family Food Packs (FFPs) are available in the region. Of these, 54,007 FFPs are stored in the DSWD Regional and Rented Warehouses, while 113,338 FFPs are prepositioned in local government unit (LGU) warehouses;
- Additionally, there are a total of PhP 143,205,435.34 available for various food and non-food items. This amount includes PhP 214.40 allocated for raw materials and PhP 142,205,765.30 designated for non-food items;

b. Preparedness and Response Plan

• Monitoring and Coordination

The Field Office (FO) will continue closely monitoring PAGASA weather updates to ensure timely preparedness and response to any potential weather-related incidents during the Semana Santa observance;

• Heightened Alert Status

The Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) personnel and the FO's Quick Response Teams (QRTs) will remain on heightened alert throughout the period to ensure rapid mobilization if emergencies arise;

• Field Operations and Reporting

SWAD Team Leaders are directed to closely monitor their Areas of Responsibility (AORs) and maintain regular communication. They must submit timely and detailed incident reports on any weather-related events, emergencies, or community activities that may require coordination or intervention;

• Preparedness Support

All teams are advised to ensure readiness of resources and communication lines to support a coordinated and efficient response, if needed, in line with the Field Office's disaster preparedness protocols.

DOH

- Issued DOH Memorandum re: Declaration of Code White Alert in Observance of the Holy Week 2025;
- Issued Regional Personnel Order No. 2025-0082 re: On-Call Emergency Officers of the Day (EOD), Logistics and Rapid Health Assessment Staff from January to June 2025 at RHEM Unit for Activation;
- Issued Regional Personnel Order No. 2025-0083 re: Stand-by Emergency Response Team for the Period of January to June 2025.

DICT

- Conduct a thorough inventory of available communications equipment in both DICT Provincial Offices and the Regional Office;
- Ensure the DICT DRRM continues to monitor social media for any potential events that could disrupt communications;
- Coordinate with the Provincial Wi-Fi Team to assess the status of Regional-Initiated Wi-Fi Sites;
- Confirm that all battery-powered communications equipment is fully charged;
- Maintain a supply of standby fuel to address potential power outages;
- MOVE set and other communication resources are on standby.

PNP

- Issued a Memorandum dated April 11, 2025, re: Preparedness Measures and Response Action Plan for the Observance of Holy Week (Semana Santa) 2025, outlining the following supplemental guidelines aimed at maintaining peace and order, enforcing laws, and providing police and public safety services to ensure a solemn, meaningful, safe, and orderly observance of the Holy Week from April 12 to 21, 2025:
 - Intensifying checkpoint operations to ensure the safety and security of all commuters;
 - Maximizing the deployment of personnel, especially to churches, pilgrim sites, terminals, resorts, beaches, recreational areas, and other areas to ensure the safety of tourists and the general public;
 - Mobilizing Force Multipliers to assist in enforcing ordinances, such as those prohibiting noises and drinking in restricted places;
 - Constantly reminding the community/crowd about regulations and encouraging vigilance against criminal activities through the conduct of "Oplan Bandillo";
 - Enhancing collaboration with other concerned law enforcement agencies, Local Government Units (LGUs), private security providers, and other force multipliers to prevent or minimize the occurrence of crimes;
 - Coordination with LGUs for the conduct of random inspection of business establishments to ensure compliance with safety regulations;
 - Working closely with local authorities to mandate the employment of lifeguards in beaches and swimming pools, especially in areas prone to drowning incidents;
 - Conducting Red Teaming Operations in coordination with the RDRRMC/PDRRMC for the Management of Critical Incidents;
 - Providing traffic assistance in major thoroughfares, tourist destinations, and other areas with ongoing road construction/rehabilitations;
 - Establishing Public Assistance Desk/Tourist Protection Assistance Desk in a conspicuous place at international/domestic airports;
 - Utilization of the AVSEU13 EOD and Canine Unit to conduct inspection and clearing of airport vicinities and parking areas;
 - Establishing Public Assistance Desk/Tourist Protection Assistance Desk in a conspicuous area at seaports, in coordination with the Philippine Ports Authority (PPA);
 - Deployment of water assets in beach resorts with a high number of tourists;
 - Deployment of canine units in airports and seaports in coordination with AVSU13 and RMU135.

PCG

- Activated OPLAN BYAHENG AYOS: Semana Santa & Summer Vacation 2025 from April 13 to 20, 2025, to assist and ensure the safety and convenience of passengers;

- Coast Guard District Northeastern Mindanao released a list of hotline numbers for its offices across the Caraga region in response to the expected surge of passengers at terminals, seaports, and airports.

AGUSAN DEL NORTE

- The Agusan del Norte PDRRM-Emergency Operations Center (PDRRM-EOC) has been activated under Code Blue status (Heightened Alert and Monitoring), following the advisory from the Office of Civil Defense (OCD) Caraga;
- Maintains close coordination and monitoring with the eleven (11) Local Government Units (LGUs) of Agusan del Norte;
- Standby responders are on duty 24/7 at the EOC located in Brgy. Sanghan, Cabadbaran City, Agusan del Norte;
- Submits regular reports to Caraga RDRRM-EOC as part of ongoing monitoring and response efforts.

AGUSAN DEL SUR

- Issued PDRRMO MC re: Preparedness Measures and Raising of PDRRMOC Alert Status to BLUE in Observance of the Holy Week (Semana Santa) 2025;
- Activation of Emergency Operation Center (24/7);
- Raising of PDRRMOC alert status into BLUE from April 12-21, 2025;
- Close monitoring of the AORs in observance of the Holy Week (Semana Santa);
- Advise all LDRRMOs to undertake precautionary measures giving emphasis on proactive measures during this period;
- C/MDRRMOs are advised to activate their respective Emergency Operations Center (24/7);
- Ensure prompt and continuous coordination of response efforts relative to the event with other concerned agencies; and
- Report any related incidents during the BLUE alert status.

SURIGAO DEL SUR

- Issued PDRRMC-SDS Advisory No. 02, Series of 2025, re: Raising the Entire Province To "Blue Alert Status" In Observance of the Holy Week (Semana Santa) from April 16-20, 2025;
- Advised all LCEs within the province to implement precautionary measures and necessary preparedness and response protocols during the observance of the Holy Week, with the goal of achieving "Zero Casualty", as follows:
 - Continuous Monitoring/tracking of weather advisories and updates from authorities such as PAGASA, NDRRMC, and OCD to take timely and appropriate actions for preparedness and response;
 - Monitor and implement precautionary measures on all national highways, major roads, and alternative routes within the area of responsibility (AOR) to manage the influx of travelers to public places;
 - Ensure the activation of Emergency Preparedness Protocols (EPP) and maintain 24/7 operations of Emergency Operations Centers (EOCs);
 - Monitor and enforce precautionary measures for all religious gatherings within respective AORs;
 - Monitor and apply precautionary measures for resorts, beaches, and rivers to ensure safety during water-related activities in respective AORs;
 - Submit regular Situational Reports (SitRep) regarding untoward incidents to the Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (PDRRMO) for consolidation and subsequent submission to Caraga RDRRM-EOC.

TANDAG CITY, SURIGAO DEL SUR

Based on the "Preparedness Measures and Response Action Plan for City of Tandag Observance of the Holy Week 2025", the preparedness measures of Tandag City for the Semana Santa include:

- Traffic Management and Crowd Control

- o Traffic Diversion Plans: Alternative routes will be designated to ensure smooth traffic flow during religious processions and other key Holy Week events;
- o Presence of Traffic Marshals and Enforcers: Traffic officers will be deployed to direct traffic during peak hours and around event venues;
- o Crowd Management: Designated areas for congregations and processions will be established to avoid overcrowding;
- o Public Announcements: Information will be issued through social media, radio, and other media platforms;
- Health and Medical Response
 - o First-Aid Stations: Mobile medical teams and first-aid stations will be set up at strategic locations during mass gatherings, processions, and in identified tourism areas;
 - o Emergency Medical Evacuation Plans: Ambulances and medical teams will be on standby for emergency medical evacuations in case of accidents or health emergencies;
 - o Deployment of First Aid Responders: First responders from the Community First Responders along beach zones and visibility of responders and rescuers from CDRRMO and Tandag City Coast Guard personnel will be deployed;
 - o Health Advisory: Residents will be reminded to bring water, wear comfortable clothing, and be cautious of heatstroke during outdoor activities;
 - o Widely dissemination of local emergency hotline numbers;
- Security and Law Enforcement
 - o Police Visibility: Additional police forces will be deployed to ensure the safety of the public during religious activities and events;
 - o Security Protocols for Processions: PNP will be stationed along procession routes and near churches to prevent untoward incidents;
 - o Surveillance: Use of CCTV cameras in critical areas to monitor public movement and ensure the safety of all attendees;
- Fire Prevention and Safety
 - o Fire Safety Measures: Fire trucks and personnel will be on standby.

BUTUAN CITY

- Issued CDRRMC Memorandum Order No.009, series of 2025 re: Activation of Emergency Operations Center and Response for Close Monitoring and Heighten Alert in the Observance of the Holy Week 2025;
- The CDRRMC Council and BDRRM Committees are advised to conduct risk assessment and implement preventive measures to ensure a safe Holy Week and summer vacation in their respective areas of responsibility;
- All BDRRM Committees are enjoined to monitor their respective AORs;
- BDRRMCs are also enjoined to report any untoward incidents, especially on the possible hazards that may exist during the observance of Holy Week;
- The CDRRM Department actively monitors the season and is on heightened alert status;
- CDRRMD conducted an inventory of all resources (manpower, vehicle, equipment, and stockpile relief);
- Response teams and other resources are on STAND-BY, ready for deployment for any eventualities;
- All CDRRMC Member Offices, BDRRMCs, and National Line Agencies in Butuan City are encouraged to submit reports on their preparedness measures and/or actions taken to the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Department (CDRRMD) through the contact details above.
