I. SITUATION OVERVIEW

A. Chronology and Tracking

27 June 2013

- The Low Pressure Area (LPA) east of Surigao City developed into a Tropical Depression (TD) and was named "GORIO"

28 June 2013

- TD "GORIO" remained almost stationary as it changed direction slightly
 - At 11:00 AM, TD "GORIO" slightly accelerated and moved closer to Eastern Visayas
 - At 11:00 PM, it developed into a Tropical Storm (TS) as it continued to move closer to Eastern Visayas

29 June 2013

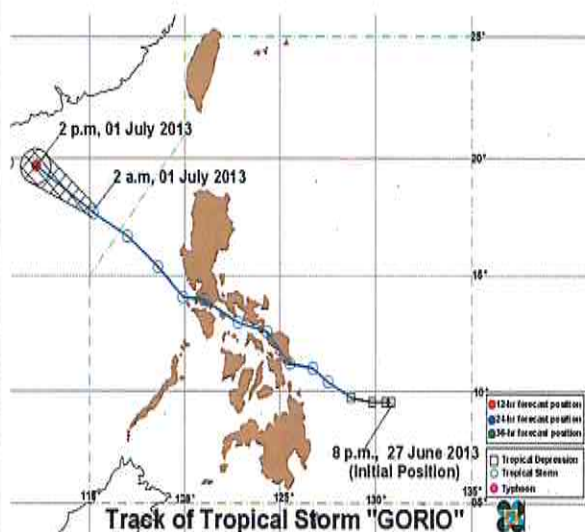
- At 11:00 AM, TS "GORIO" made a landfall over Hernani, Eastern Samar
 - On or about 5:00 PM, it accelerated and moved over Sorsogon Bay
 - At 11:00 PM, TS "GORIO" moved in a west northwest direction

30 June 2013

- At 5:00 AM, TS "GORIO" was spotted in the vicinity of Batangas and maintained its strength
 - On or about 11:00 AM, it was located over the West Philippine Sea after passing Lubang Island

01 July 2013

- At 4:00 AM, TS "GORIO" gained more strength and speed as it moved farther away from the country towards Southern China



B. Tropical Cyclone Analysis

Tropical Storm "GORIO" is the 7th weather disturbance to enter the Philippine Area of Responsibility (PAR) and the 3rd tropical cyclone to directly hit the country for 2013. The maximum sustained winds of the tropical storm ranged from 45 – 85 kph and gustiness of 45 – 100 kph. It was almost stationary until it developed from being a Low Pressure Area (LPA) into a Tropical Depression (TD) and gradually increased its speed as it continued to traverse over the country with a speed that ranged from 7 – 30 kph.

Public Storm Warning Signal (PSWS) Nos. 1 and 2 were raised in the following provinces:

At the height of the tropical storm, thousands of passengers in several ports were stranded in Southern Luzon, Central and Eastern Visayas, and Northern Mindanao. Seven (7) reported incidents were monitored in CALABARZON, MIMAROPA, Bicol Region and Western Visayas.

II. EFFECTS

A. INCIDENTS MONITORED (TAB A)

- **A total of seven (7) incidents were monitored in Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, and VI:** one (1) landslide incident in Masbate; two (2) flooding incidents in Bulalacao and Lubang, Occidental Mindoro; one (1) occurrence of tornado in Quezon Province; one (1) case of uprooted trees and fallen post in Antipolo City; one (1) whirlwind incident in Sorsogon; and one (1) capsizing incident in Concepcion, Iloilo which resulted to the death of seven (7) individuals



B. AFFECTED POPULATION

- In the wake of Tropical Storm "GORIO", **a total of 1,329 families or about 6,418 individuals** were affected in twenty-five (25) barangays of seven (7) municipalities in five (5) provinces of Regions IV-A, IV-B, V, VI, and VIII (Tab B)
- A total of **twelve (12) evacuation centers** were established to temporarily shelter **674 families / 3,972 individuals** that were affected

C. COST OF ASSISTANCE

- A total of **PhP221,128.33 worth of assorted relief goods** were provided to the affected families and strandeers:

D. CASUALTIES

- Tropical Storm "GORIO" left **a total of nineteen (19) casualties, of which, seven (7) died** due to drowning as a result of the capsized motorbanca incident that occurred in Concepcion, Iloilo; while **eight (8) others were rescued**; **four (4) individuals were injured** due to the tornado incident in Jomalig, Quezon

F. DAMAGED HOUSES

- Seventy-one (71) houses were affected** in Regions IV-A, V, and VIII, of which, **forty-eight (48) were partially damaged** while **twenty-three (23) were totally destroyed**

G. STRANDED PASSENGERS / VESSELS / ROLLING CARGOES / MOTORIZED BANCAS

- TS "GORIO" it affected several ports all over the country, particularly in Central and Eastern Visayas, Southern Luzon, Bicol, Northern Mindanao and Palawan
- A **total of 14,957 passengers, 109 vessels, 1,281 rolling cargoes, and 4 motorized bancas** were stranded in Central, Eastern and Western Visayas, Palawan, Southern Luzon, Bicol, and Northern Mindanao



H. STATUS OF LIFELINES

- At the height of the weather disturbance, **areas in Regions IV-A, IV-B, VIII, and CAR experienced power outages.** Power supplies in Laguna, Quezon

Province, Romblon, Marinduque and Eastern Samar were interrupted however, all lines that tripped were restored at the soonest possible time

- On 30 June 2013, all transmission, sub-transmission lines and substations of the National Grid Corporation of the Philippines (NGCP) have been operating under normal conditions. All restoration works in areas affected by the storm, specifically in Visayas, were completed
- Several road sections in Regions V, VIII and CAR were impassable due to the heavy downpour. Minor landslides and floodings affecting road sections such as Kabayan–Buguias Road, Man-asok Section in Abatan, Benguet; Masbate–Cataingan–Placer–Daraga Road; Brgy. San Pablo, Naval, Biliran; Brgy. Capokpok, Tabango, Leyte; and Brgy. Bulalacao, Kawayan Section, Biliran Province

I. OTHER EFFECTS

FLOODED AREAS

- Areas in Metro Manila were reported to be flooded due to the rain brought by TS “GORIO”: Pio Del Pilar, Makati; Sto. Rosario, Celia, Sta. Ana, and Sta. Lucia in Plainview, Mandaluyong; Lerma, I. Lopez and F. Ortigas in New Zaniga in Mandaluyong. Water levels in the said areas reached at least 17 inches, thus, did not result to prolonged traffic or obstructed road sections

CANCELLED FLIGHTS

- For two consecutive days (29 – 30 June 2013), a total of 25 domestic flights were cancelled due to the bad weather

NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS and RESPONSE MANAGEMENT**

NDRRMC

- **NDRRMC Operations Center raised** was placed on BLUE ALERT Status from 28 June 2013-1 July 2013
- Continuously disseminated Weather Bulletins/Advisories, Gale Warnings, General Flood Advisories, and 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts to all RDRRMCs/OCDRCs through SMS, facsimile, and websites for further dissemination to their respective Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Councils (LDRRMCs)
- Directed RDRRMCs concerned through the OCD Regional Centers to undertake precautionary measures in their respective regions

PAG-ASA disseminated Weather Bulletins/Advisories, General Flood Advisories, Gale Warning, and 24-Hour Public Weather Forecasts

DOH

- **DOH HEMS OpCen** raised code white alert (active monitoring); and sent weather alert to all CHDs
- **DOH CHD I** activated its Operations Center; stockpiled medicines; laced medical Response and Health Assessment Teams on standby status; established direct coordination and linkages with 3 DOH-retained hospitals (ITRMC-San Fernando City, La Union, R1MC-Dagupan City, Pangasinan, MMH and MC-Batac City, Ilocos Norte)
- **DOH CHED IV-B** coordinated with all CHD extension office, Provincial Health Team Office and City Health Team Offices; and prepositioned assorted drug and medicines in five provinces of MIMAROPA
- **DOH CHD V** raised code white alert status and coordinated with PHO-HEMS for preparations and continuous monitoring thru PHTOs and PHEMs Coordinators; and activated CHD Bicol operations center

DSWD

- Prepositioned **PhP140.19 million** worth of emergency relief resources consisting of standby funds (**PhP5.05 million**), **41,708** family food packs (**PhP10.49 million**), other food items (**PhP39.66 million**) and NFIs (**PhP84.98 million**)

- **DSWD I** prepositioned 500 family packs for the provinces of Ilocos Norte, Ilocos Sur, La Union and Pangasinan; allocated worth PhP300,000 standby fund from the Quick Response Fund (QRF); implemented Cash-for-Work program in flood-prone areas for canal/river de-clogging; assessed and prepared the identified evacuation centers and locations of community kitchen; and active involvement of SWAD team
- **DSWD IV-B** alerted all Social and Welfare and Development Team Staff and Quick Response Team
- **DSWD V** allocated standby fund amounting to **PhP1.2M** for disaster operation; prepositioned 2,000 family food packs and 5,000 sacks of rice; extended 20 sacks of rice to LGU of Libon for 300 families
- **DSWD VII** provided food items to stranded passengers

DPWH

- Activated District Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Teams to monitor situational status of national roads and bridges
- **DPWH I** activated their operations center and district Disaster Action Teams; placed district and maintenance crew on standby; and prepositioned assets
- **DPWH IV-B** prepositioned heavy equipment in strategic areas for possible clearing operations
- **Masbate 2nd District Engineering Office of DPWH V** conducted road clearing operations at Masbate-Cataingan-Placer-Daraga Road (K0027-K0028), Barangay Panisijan, Uson, Masbate
- **DPWH VIII** monitored status of major roads especially in the provinces of Samar
- **DPWH CAR** conducted clearing operations along Kabayan – Buguias Road and prepositioned the following:

AFP

- **Philippine Army 8th Infantry Division and 9th Infantry Division DRO units** were on standby alert status
- **Naval Forces Southern Luzon (NAVFORSOL) Bicol DRO Unit** on standby, monitored the weather situation; and prepositioned one (1) SAR Team at Polangui Municipal Hall, Albay to provide assistance
- **NAVFORNOL** implemented "Oplan Saranay" to mobilize AFP resources and prepositioned assets
- **Tactical Operations Group (TOG) 8-PAF and 2 TOG 5-PAF DRU** were placed on standby
- **TOG 5-PAF** prepositioned one (1) SAR Team at the Oas Municipal Hall, Albay to provide assistance in the evacuation of affected families
- Activated 9ID Task Group "Sagip"
- Alerted 10 DRO Platoons (2 Platoons on Albay, 1 Platoon in Catanduanes, 2 Platoons on Sorsogon, 1 Platoon in Masbate, 2 Platoons in Camarines Norte and 2 Platoons in Camarines Sur)

- **JTF-NCR** was on standby status for possible deployment and maintained 24/7 monitoring of the situation at MMDA

PCG

- **PCG Units** were placed on heightened alert to ensure the strict implementation of HPCG Memorandum Circular 02-13 (Guidelines on the Movement of Vessels during Heavy Weather) on affected areas
- **Coast Guard District (CGD) Palawan** and **CGD Southern Tagalog** disseminated weather bulletin and gale warning to their respective stations and detachments
- **CGD Southern Tagalog** suspended all sea travels in the region
- **CGD Bicol Disaster Response Group** teams were placed on standby; disseminated weather updates and strictly implemented **"NO SAILING POLICY"**
- **PCG Stations Tacloban City and Catbalogan City** alerted and advised fishermen and other small sea crafts not to venture out into the sea
- **CGD Northwestern Luzon** activated their operations center; alerted WASAR Teams for possible response mobilization; implemented the prevention of fisher folks and other small sea vessel from venturing out the sea
- **PCG Iloilo** suspended sea craft trips in the northeastern part of Iloilo
- PCG Detachment in Concepcion conducted Search and Rescue (SAR) operations for the three (3) missing persons re capsized m/banca
- **PCG-STL** was on standby and advised all the vessels not to sail
- **PCG Deployable Response Group (DRG) of Coast Guard District Southern Tagalog, NCR-CL and NorthWestern Luzon** were placed on standby for possible deployment
- **Coast Guard Detachment Roxas** provided assistance in the distribution of food packs for the stranded passengers in Dangay Port
- **PCG District Bicol** dispatched a team to assess and provide assistance in Brgy. San Roque, Legazpi City re MINH TUAN68 vessel incident

KABALIKAT CIVICOM MARINDUQUE was placed on 24-hour standby mode and disseminated weather updates thru radio and SMS

PPA CALAPAN CITY, ORIENTAL MINDORO assisted stranded passengers/rolling cargoes and ensured safety and security of the travelling public

PNP

- **National Disaster Operations Center (NDOC)** was activated effective at 8:00 AM, 30 June 2013 at the National Operations Center manned by members of the PNP Sub-Committee on Disaster Management (PNP SCDM)
- **PRO 1** was placed on alert status; conducted assessment of the disaster preparedness plan and inventory of resources and equipment for relief, rescue and rehabilitation operations
- **PRO 8** monitored the situation in their area of responsibility
- **PRO 5** with 6-man teams, 3 rubber boats, 1 troop carrier was placed on standby alert
- **PRO IV-A** advised all Provincial Police Offices (PPOs), City/Municipal Police Stations to monitor weather situation and assisted the LDRRMCs in the conduct of evacuation and SAR Operations
- **PRO IV-B** coordinated with the RDRRMC

PIA

- **PIA 1 and PIA 8** disseminated weather bulletins/advisories to the public and media

DILG

- Disseminated weather advisories/bulletins thru SMS to their provincial offices and CLGOO in the region

- **DILG 1** monitored the situation and coordinated with other agencies; advised Municipal Local Government Operation Officers (MLGOOs) to go on 24-hour duty and to implement pre-emptive evacuation in high risk areas if situation demands
- **DILG NCR** was on 24/7 mode and required all internet-enabled barangays to record and submit flood monitors

PRC

- Was placed on standby alert status
- Activated Alert Level 1 among chapters under Public Storm Warning Signals No. 2 and 1
- Disseminated weather bulletins to chapters likely to be affected
